Fisheries Law is a specialised reference for anyone required to provide advice or to research information relating to the regulation and management of New Zealand's fisheries.

First published in 1995, *Fisheries Law* contains full commentary and analysis of the Fisheries Act 1996, with extensive links to other legislation and regulations covering the management, conservation and farming of fisheries resources.

Detailed references to case law which interprets the legislation are also included. Relatively few fisheries cases have been reported, and this makes *Fisheries Law* a valuable resource for everyone who needs to track Court decisions on fisheries regulation.

The service also contains a comprehensive collection of the regulations, notices and orders which impose regulatory requirements both nationally and regionally.

As well as section-by-section analysis, *Fisheries Law* also contains a number of overviews of fisheries law in New Zealand, placing legislation and regulatory provisions in their historical context and allowing easy tracking of the relationships between repealed and current legislation.

Maori fisheries receive detailed treatment, with extensive coverage of the historical development and reasons for the legislation in force today.

Fisheries Law is an essential reference for anyone providing legal advice to fishing industry participants or any organisation or business involved in the fishing industry.

DELIVERY ON BROOKERS ONLINE

Fisheries Law Online is available on the internet through Brookers Online. Brookers Online is New Zealand's most up-to-date legal online information service. Subscribers are able to view additions or amendments made by a Brookers editor to a piece of legislation or commentary the very next day. "What's New" keeps subscribers updated with all changes made to a database on a daily basis. Brookers Online includes the following easy-to-use features:

Searching

- Search across multiple Brookers Online databases simultaneously using the powerful MegaSearch feature;
- Search from any page. Use the "quick search" feature on any page to perform a simple free-text or document title search across a database;
- The intuitive Legislation Title Search Assistant makes it easy to find an Act or Regulation without knowing its exact title.

Navigation

- Research Trail feature allows you to back-track to a document accessed earlier in your session – so you never get lost;
- Related Content Menus. Brookers Online databases are fully integrated, meaning you will be able to link to any case law or precedents which relate to the legislation you have accessed, or vice versa;
- Preview Pane. Sometimes Related Content menus contain large numbers of links (such as case law related to frequently cited Acts). Here you can use the Preview Pane to "take a peek" at the linked documents without losing your place;
- Commentary Anywhere. Because Brookers Online is fully integrated, you can view legislative commentary from any product which contains the same legislation. For example, you can view commentary on the High Court Rules from *McGechan on Procedure* while you are using the *Brookers Company Law* database (subscription to both products required).

Printing

- "Print this Document" means you can print the page you're looking at easily and quickly;
- "My Selections" lets you select multiple documents to print as you go and compile them at the end of your session to a single print-out, or export them to PDF;
- "Export to PDF" is particularly useful for creating PDFs of whole Acts or Regulations.

Other Features

- Bookmarking. Add a document or frequently-used search to your "Favourites" menu and find things faster next time;
- Email. Use the Email Link features to send a link to a document to a colleague;
- Hide/Show. Brookers Online displays commentary and annotations section-by-section by default. You can hide this to read legislation on your screen faster, or to exclude the commentary and annotations from your print version.
